### **Definitions**

1. Definition of Racism (systemic not personal):

Racism = Race Prejudice + *Misuse* of Power of Systems and Institutions.

2. **Isn't** <u>racism</u> just <u>prejudice</u>? Prejudice is what the word says: pre-judging – without knowing all the facts or without knowing the reality of a person, his/her character, intentions, good will, family, daily situations.

It is often judgment based on looks, association, and assumptions which often can be unconscious. All people are racially prejudiced (regardless of racial/ethnic identity). Racism includes prejudice, but racism has the power for that prejudice to be enforced in society.

#### 3. How does discrimination fit into this?

- Prejudice makes assumptions about the abilities, motives, and intentions of others according to their race.
- Discrimination means I act on that prejudice. These actions (usually

negative) are toward others according to their race.

#### 4. The power of racism

- allows for power over some persons,
- gives privilege to others,
- and the effects of racism hurt all.

#### 5. White Privilege

- White privilege refers to the social advantages, benefits, and courtesies that come with being a member of the dominant race.
- Racism puts persons of color at a disadvantage; white privilege puts white persons at an advantage.
- **6. Racial Microagressions** are brief and commonplace daily verbal, behavioral, and environmental indignities that communicate hostile, derogatory, or negative racial slights and insults to the target person or group. They can be intentional or unintentional.
